# Choosing One of Minnesota's Private Colleges

---

## THE FACTS

A liberal arts education from one of Minnesota's 17 private colleges and universities broadens horizons, sharpens communication and decision-making skills and equips students for participating in work and society. Here are some good reasons you should consider one of our colleges or universities.

## Students and Degrees

- Minnesota's Private Colleges enroll 60,324 students (43,024 undergraduates and 17,300 graduate and professional students).
- Minnesota's Private Colleges award nearly one-third of the state's four-year degrees (you can use our College Finder tool to search for majors at [www.mnprivatecolleges.org/college-finder](http://www.mnprivatecolleges.org/college-finder)), including:
  - 50% of all physical science degrees
  - 46% of all mathematics and statistics degrees
  - 40% of all health profession degrees
  - 36% of all biological and biomedical science degrees
  - 36% of all foreign language degrees
  - 29% of all visual and performing arts degrees
  - 34% of all business degrees
  - 19% of all education degrees (many future teachers from our colleges do not major in education but complete a liberal arts major in the field of their choice)

## Excellence

- Minnesota's Private Colleges are committed to undergraduate teaching with:
  - One professor for every 12 students
  - Average class size of less than 20 students
  - Courses taught by highly qualified faculty, not teaching assistants
- We asked graduates of Minnesota's private colleges and universities about their college experience. They reported that:
  - Teachers were interested in them as students and as individuals.
  - They were challenged in the classroom and their professors helped them to meet the challenges.
  - Professors continue to be their mentors and role models after graduation.
  - They benefited from small class sizes, frequent interaction with professors, stimulating classroom discussions and a variety of research and study opportunities.
  - They are more politically and socially aware of the world around them, they have gained a deeper appreciation for the fine arts and they have a sense of purpose in life.
- 64% of private college students graduate within four years and 74% within six years — the best rates in Minnesota and the Midwest.

## Access and Diversity

- More than 2,700 transfer students continue their studies at one of Minnesota's Private Colleges; 23% of all new students on campus each year are transfer students.
- 20% of our students are first generation college students, meaning that they are the first in their family to go to college.

- More than 18% of new entering students come from under-represented groups, exceeding Minnesota's overall racial and ethnic demographics.
- Almost 8,000 students of color, excluding international students, enroll at Minnesota's Private Colleges.

## FINANCIAL AID

We want prospective students and their families to know that ability, motivation and values are more important than their bank balance. Most students and their families are surprised to learn that:

- More than 25% of private college students come from families with incomes less than \$50,000 — about the same proportion as at the state's public four-year colleges and universities.
- 92% of our undergraduates receive grants and scholarships from a variety of sources that don't have to be paid back.
- Our institutions provide more than \$374 million in institutional grants and \$16 million in private scholarships each year.
- Thanks to financial aid, the average amount that families actually pay for tuition is considerably less than the posted price — about half.
- Grants, scholarships, low-interest loans and work-study opportunities are available at private colleges to help cover tuition, fees, room and board, books and miscellaneous expenses averaging \$40,534 for the 2011-2012 academic year (see list of all tuition and fees at [www.mnprivatecolleges.org/how-pay/what-does-it-cost](http://www.mnprivatecolleges.org/how-pay/what-does-it-cost)).
- Transfer scholarships are available based on leadership and academic achievements and vary by campus. Please contact the college admissions offices to obtain application requirements and scholarship deadlines.

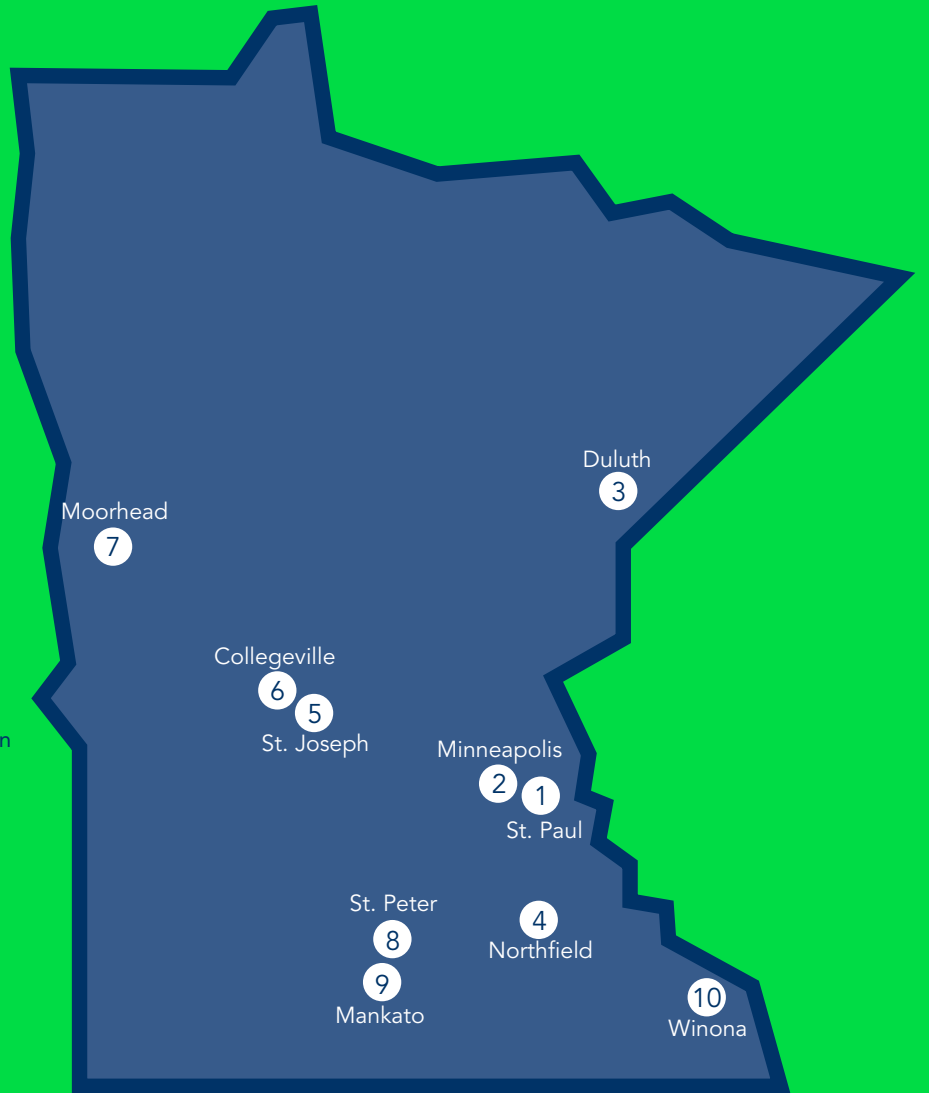
