A liberal arts education from one of Minnesota's 17 private colleges and universities broadens horizons, sharpens communication and decision-making skills and equips students for participating in work and society. Here are some good reasons you should consider one of our colleges or universities.

- ✓ Minnesota's Private Colleges **enroll 59,095 students** (42,694 undergraduates and 16,401 graduate and professional students).
- ✓ Each year, more than 2,800 transfer students continue their studies at one of Minnesota's private colleges and universities. **Twenty-four percent of all new students on campus each year are transfer students.**
- ✓ **Sixty-five percent of private college students graduate within four years** and 74 percent within six years – the best rates in Minnesota.
- ✓ **Three out of four private college graduates go on immediately to full-time employment.**
- ✓ **One-fifth of our alumni pursue graduate-level education** immediately upon earning their bachelor's degree.

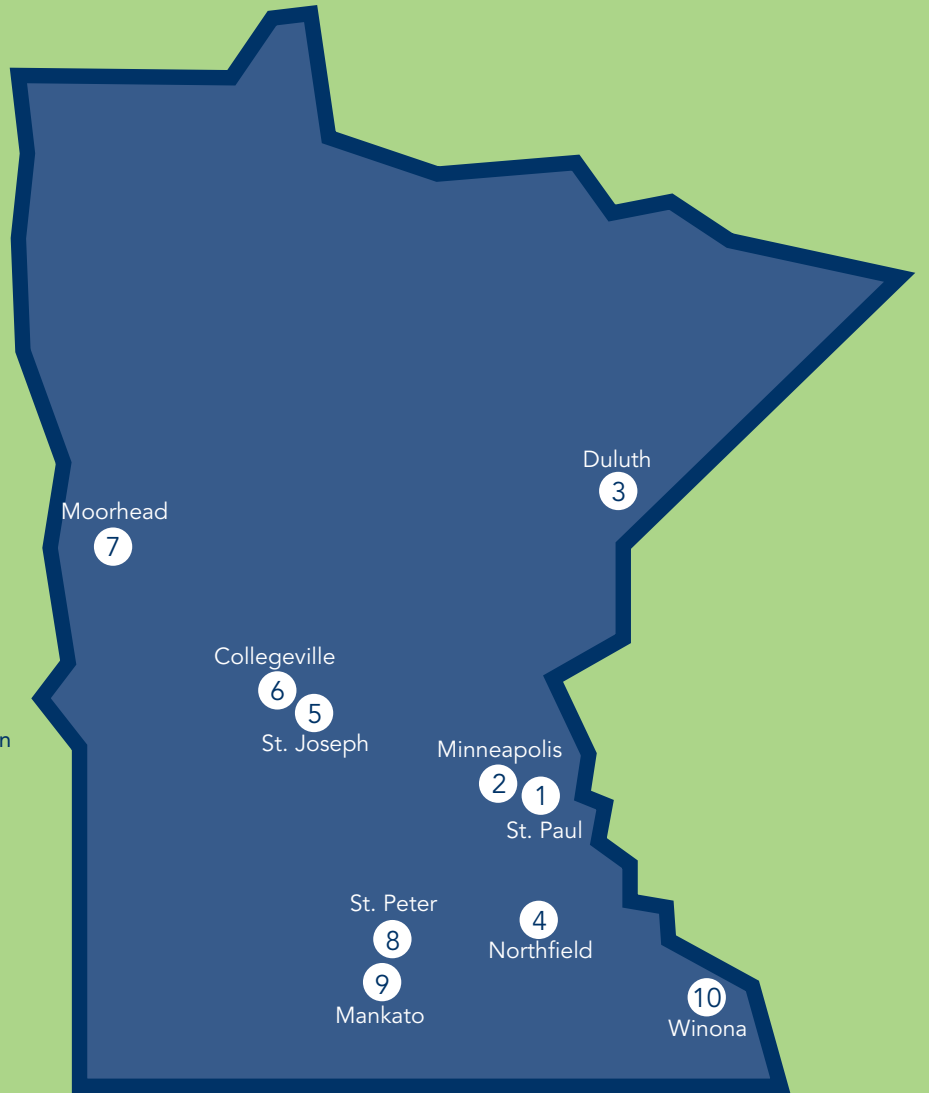
